In a recent meeting with fellow festival organizations from around the world, I remember one colleague from Germany stating that "the development of future festivals is now affected by the pandemic, war and climate change, never to be the same again." We all must now find solutions to new challenges.





For the Montana International Choral Festival, some of our challenges are quite significant. For example, finding host families to house our international choirs becomes more and more of an effort. We have been one of the very few quality festivals around the world to offer this "free housing and meals" aspect, and when I am recruiting choirs to come to Missoula, it indeed was often a game changer in choirs deciding to participate. Traveling to Missoula is a huge financial burden for choirs, and anything we can do to help them be part of our community and share their music and lives with us for 5 or 6 days goes a long way in not only their decision to come to Missoula, but hopefully return for future festivals. That is why next year, we will be seeing not only new choirs, but choirs that have previously been to our festival, renewing friendships from the past and creating pathways for world communications via music and stories. smiles, and laughter.

The Montana International Choral Festival has become a highly respected festival and choirs from around the world know of us. This is because of great organization, quality choirs, and a community that reaches out to our choirs as hosts and audience members. We are so excited to be moving forward with our festival next July. Most of the choirs that were scheduled to come this summer have agreed to participate in 2023, which is wonderful news!
